John, the lime-master's second son, became farmer at Crooklands, Auchengray, near to the Calla crofts previously referred to. Catherine Leckie, his wife, bore him four sons and four daughters.

John succeeded his father, having as wife his cousin, Elizabeth Black, from Blackfaulds. They had a numerous family of both sexes. After leaving the farm, and staying some time in Longridge, the whole family emigrated to New Zealand about 1859.

Thomas, second Crooklands son, married Agnes Inglis, and farmed, first at Knowton, and next at Wester Breich, in company with his son, James, who had been in America.

John, his eldest son, went with his wife and children from Knowton to New Zealand, but reports from that far country are often scanty, so here, as elsewhere, the thread is broken.

James afterwards went from Wester Breich to Kirkcudbrightshire.

Catherine, one of the Knowton daughters, was married to Alexander Storrie, Dykehead. One son, Alexander, with wife and family lives at Balmore, Stirlingshire, another at Ibrox, one daughter at Ferniegair, and one at Dykehead.

David, third Crooklands son, married to Agnes Mann, farmed Westburn, and after farming some time in Carluke district, occupied New-year-field farm till his death. It was said to be this David who, on being taxed with selling thin butter milk, and told that he had no conscience, quietly responded, "Hoots aye, I've a conscience; it's maybe like (he milk, a wee thin, but I hae a conscience." His sons were John, James, David, Thomas, the latter continuing at New-year-field until going to England some years ago. John and James were farmers in Carluke vicinity, while David was located as farmer near Stirling. In this family, too, were a number of daughters with husbands and families, but various details are lacking.

Helen, a Crooklands daughter, became Mrs John Thomson, Holestock, near Longford, her sons being Robert Thomson, merchant, Longridge, and John, farmer, Kepscaith and Rashierig, whose son, John, is now an East Lothian farmer at Wheatrig, near Longniddry, having three sons and one daughter.

Mary, another Crooklands daughter, became Mrs Daniel Gardner, of Watsonfoot farm. Margaret, another daughter, was also married. Mrs Alexander, Nethermuir, Bathgate, is a descendant in the Gardner line.

Reminder: * as JB didn't mention this individual, their story ends in the table whereas ^ tells you there is another generation within this document. The accompanying tree however might show several more generations than is in this narrative.

JOHN BLACK AND CATHERINE LOCKIE

CATHERINE LOCKIE

Catherine's name was recorded as Lockie on the only two children's baptisms we have, but a birth for her (with either spelling) is not obvious. We have guessed her birth year as 1760 and refer to her as Lockie as this is the only recorded spelling we have.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

John and Catherine married around 1785. JB named only three sons and three daughters and of these, only two baptisms were located. The baptism for Helen was purchased in the hope that the family's residence was named but it wasn't. In the absence of evidence we have assumed John remained at Bushdyke until the move to Crooklands around 1800.

ELIZABETH BLACK

Elizabeth was born on 20 March 1788 at Blackfaulds. Her birth was squeezed into the Whitburn parish records of 1788

stating she was the daughter of Alexander Black and Grizel Russell from Blackfaulds.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

Contrary to JB's statement, John and Elizabeth were first cousins once removed. Their marriage was not located but occurred about 1813. From oral history and census records we are told they had nine children.

Indications are that all of the children were born in the parish of Carnwath. The 1841 census shows the family living at Crooklands (in the parish of Carnwath) but unfortunately for us, by this stage only three of their children were still living at home.

The 1851 census gives us the opportunity to find out where the family members were born. John's occupation was no longer a farmer, but an agriculture labourer and the family had moved to the purpose-built mining village of Climpy. JB states a fire had destroyed their home at Crooklands.

In the Whitburn church records we find entries, made in 1855, that record the birth and baptism of John and William, sons of John and Elizabeth Black, when they would have been 26 and 31 respectively. Why an entry was made in a register for adult children is cause for speculation. One explanation involves the family's emigration to New Zealand. If the family were assisted by the Church, as is claimed, it may have been necessary to ensure their membership was recorded in the registers. The Whitburn registers do not claim the births and baptisms occurred in Whitburn but record their occurrence in the parish of Carnwath some twelve miles as the crow flies from Whitburn. Also entered in the registers on the same date was John and Elizabeth's grandson, also John, the son of Thomas Black and Margaret Crawford. He would have been nine at the time of the entry in 1855 and his mother had by this time died and his father remarried. This entry may indicate John had moved in with his grandparents after his father remarried.

John son of Thomas Black and Margaret Crawford spouses of Carluke, parish of Carnwath was born 18 June 1846 and baptized.

The last sentence quoted from *Melodies and Memories* is also misleading; although the family did indeed emigrate in 1859, we visualise a mother, father and nine little children clutching their parents as they sailed forth to the other side of the world. The real story is quite different, and we will see that not all of their children came to New Zealand, they came at different times, and John and Elizabeth were in their seventies when they set sail from Scotland assisted by the Free Kirk of Scotland on the *Alpine* and landing at Port Chalmers on 12 September 1859. The passenger list bears out their arrival with an entry for John Black and Mrs Black. They were accompanied by their 35-year-old daughter Mary, her husband William Walker, the Walker's children and two grandchildren Jessie and John (Thomas's children). Two more of their children were on the boat but were recorded on the passenger list, whether by error or on purpose as a married couple. The couple listed after the Walkers were a second 'John Black and wife'. Evidence will show that these were John and Elizabeth's single children (also John and Elizabeth, aged 45 and 32 respectively). The 'marriage' may have been deliberate as the colony wanted married couples for free passage.

Another son of John and Elizabeth's, William had emigrated to New Zealand the previous year and another daughter Grace came thirteen years later after her husband died. Thomas remained behind in Scotland, but the fate of Catherine, Alexander and James is unknown.

DEATH AND BURIAL

After several years on their son William's farm at Milton, John and Elizabeth moved to the goldfields at Waitahuna Valley with their other children and it was here they died; John in 1870 and Elizabeth in 1872. Both were correctly 84.

AGNES INGLIS

Agnes was the daughter of John Inglis and Janet Brown and was baptised on 4 May 1800 at Carstairs.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

Thomas and Agnes Inglis married at Carstairs on 12 September 1823 when John was 34. We cannot prove the location of the children's births but believe they were at all Crooklands in the parish of Carnwath. The family were found on the census there in 1841 and Thomas's older brother John was also living there that year, so it seems both brothers remained on their father's tenant farm after they married.



HELEN BLACK

Helen was most likely born at Bushdyke and baptised on 16 March 1792 in West Calder.

John Thomson is too common a name to establish his parentage. From naming patterns we suggest the following birth as a possibility.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

To confuse matters, two Helen Blacks of a similar age, married two different John Thomsons and both lived in West Calder. We would expect to find this couple's marriage around 1817 and there isn't one, so the 1823 marriage we have accorded to the other couple.¹ Although we have attributed the seven children baptised in West Calder to this family we cannot prove if they were all the children of this couple unless we order all the baptism certificates and even that might not help.

Holestock, the location given by JB, is no longer located but he suggested it was near Longford and this farm can be identified on the A704, south of Addiewell and east of Breich. We have assumed that the children were born at Holestock as all were baptised at West Calder, except for John who was baptised at Whitburn.

Helen was 81 not the 84 claimed on the headstone. Her age on her death certificate was given as 83.

IMO John Thomson, Holestock, died 7/10/1850 aged ?? years and Helen Black his wife died 19/11/1875 aged 84 years. Helen Black Thomson daughter of said Robert Thomson, Merchant, died 9/10/1937 aged 74 years.

By the time of the first census they had moved from Carnwath to Watsonfoot, Cambusnethan. Living with them was Mary's nephew John Black (son of John and Elizabeth Black). In 1851 they were still at Watsonfoot but the ages of the children were not accurately recorded.





One page of the Livingston parish records lists the baptisms of the children born to this couple and this is given below. We have updated some of the birthplaces as a result of finding this document.

We have already established that the location of Westburn is no longer found in West Calder, and this was also where David's uncle, William Black (and Jean Cleland) farmed. The family's next move, JB tells us, was to the Carluke area where he farmed for some time but before then we find four baptisms when the family were resident at Murieston. Carluke is where they were living in 1841 and Bowridge Farm is still found today, due north of Carluke. From census records they went there between 1833 and 1836.



DEATH AND BURIAL

Otago Witness 17 April 1901

The Palmerston Times reports the death of another old settler of the province in the person of Mr John Black, of Shag Valley, whose demise occurred rather suddenly on the 8th. Mr Black who had reached the age of 70 years, was a native of Shotts, Scotland, and came out to Otago, with his wife and three daughters, on the ship Storm Cloud, in 1861 After remaining in Dunedin for some time, he engaged by the Provincial Government in connection with road formation in the Moeraki district. On the land in Shag Valley being surveyed and cut up into farms in 1863, the deceased took up his present holding and was, in fact, the first settler in the Valley. He was a practical farmer, having been brought up to farming at Home, and had naturally acquired a taste for agricultural pursuits. Mr Black was not in any sense a public man, but was regarded as an excellent neighbour and settler. He leaves a wife and 11 children — seven sons and four daughters, all grown up, three sons and three daughters being married — and 32 grandchildren to mourn their loss.

James died on 8 April 1901 and Mary on Christmas Day 1913.

JANE RUSSELL MURRAY

We have a birthdate for Jane as 23 December 1855. She was found on the census living with her grandparents the Russells and her father James, aged 23. She was registered as Jane Murray, but her mother is unknown.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

The two married in Whitburn in 1888. As recorded by JB we found three sons and one daughter, but the indexes indicate that several children died in infancy, including one born before they married.
