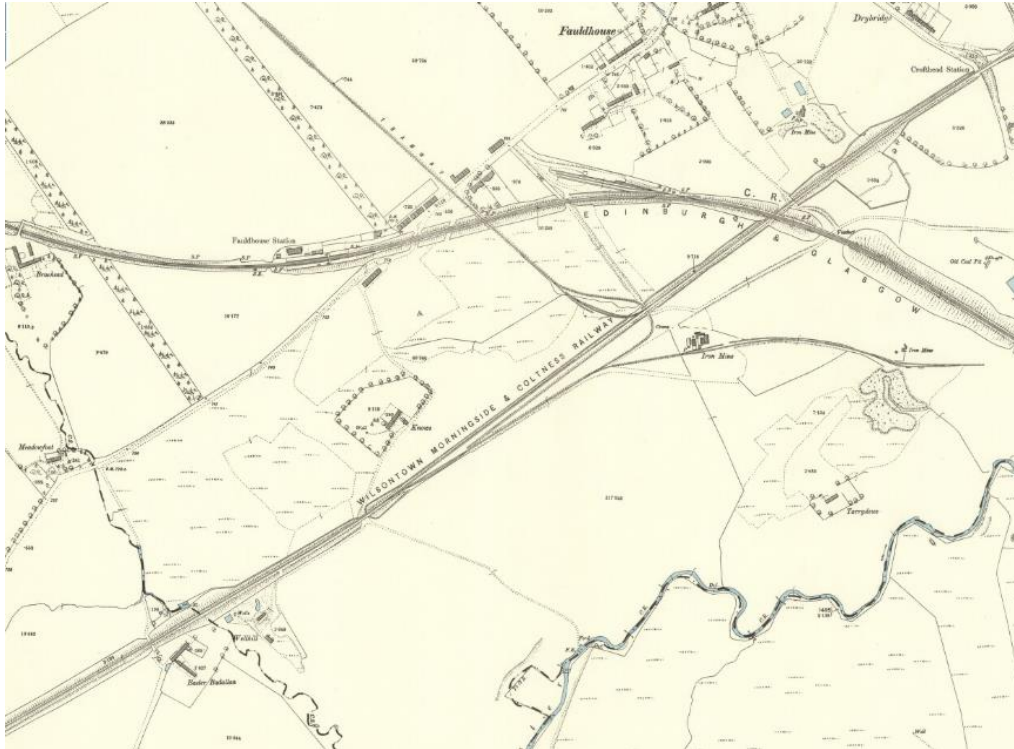

Robert, fifth Bushdyke son, was born in 1775, died 1843. It would appear that Blackburn was his first holding, but it is certain that afterwards he lived at Wallhill, [Wellhill] his first wife being Jean Walker, and his second Catherine Thomson. There were seven sons - John, unmarried; William, whose son Robert is, or was, a land steward about Inverness; Robert, who also was survived by a family; Alexander, survived by family; James, who died young; Thomas, no record; James, seventh Wallhill son, still living in Queensland, aged eighty-three years, being the only known representative of his own generation, and probably the oldest survivor among the Blacks of Breich Water. He still writes regularly to some of his friends in Scotland. It may be noted that at present there are five or six female Blacks over eighty years of age. Wallhill daughters were Jean, Helen, and Agnes. There is a simple memorial of this family in Whitburn Churchyard.

*Reminder: * as JB didn't mention this individual, their story ends in the table whereas ^ tells you there is another generation within this document.*

The accompanying tree however might show several more generations than is in this narrative.

ROBERT BLACK AND JEAN WALKER AND CATHERINE THOMSON

**Residence – Bushdyke West Calder
Backburn, West Calder
Wellhill, Whitburn, West Lothian**

Robert, fifth Bushdyke son, was born in 1775, died 1843. It would appear that Backburn was his first holding, but it is certain that afterwards he lived at Wallhill, his first wife being **Jean Walker**, and his second **Catherine Thomson**. There were seven sons - John, ... William, ... Robert, ... James, ...Thomas, ... James. Wallhill daughters were Jean, Helen, and Agnes.

ROBERT BLACK

Robert was the youngest of eleven children born to John Black and Helen Steel and baptised on 20 October 1776.

JEAN WALKER

Jean's parents are not proved but she may be the daughter of Robert Walker and Isobel Nobel and therefore baptised on 9 March 1777 in Whitburn.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

Robert married Jean Walker on 6 June 1802, and we find nine children. John Black makes it clear that Robert held the Backburn property in West Calder, but we must point out that all the children were baptised in the neighbouring parish of Whitburn. The transcripts we have, show the children were born at either Leadloch or Wellhill, not Backburn. JB gave few details on this family and tracing them hasn't been straightforward.

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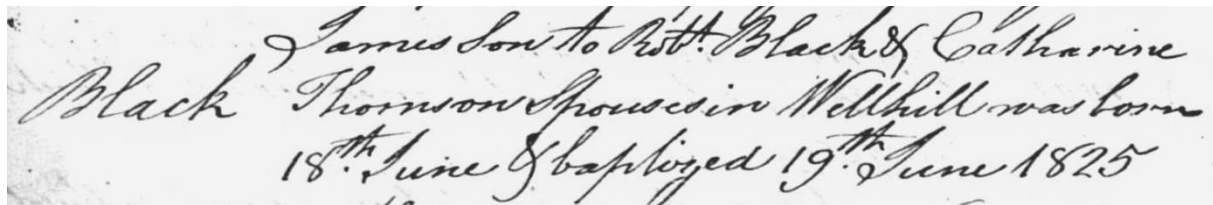
Jean may well have died in childbirth, but her death cannot be located to prove this.

CATHERINE THOMSON

There were two 'Katharine' Thompsons born in Whitburn around the right time, and she is likely to be one of these.²

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

Robert and Catherine married on 30 November 1822 in Whitburn. They had one child, James born on 18 June 1825.

DEATH AND BURIAL

Catherine's death is not located, and Robert's burial isn't found either, but it is claimed on some trees that he died on 21 September 1843. JB gave this year also.

THIRD GENERATION

CHILDREN OF ROBERT BLACK AND JEAN WALKER

JOHN BLACK

There were seven sons - **John**, unmarried;

The existence of John Black was known by JB over 100 years after his birth (which was recorded on 27 April 1803), but he is not obvious on any census. JB claimed this John never married and it is likely this was him, joining the army on 5 October 1826.

What happened to him after that is unknown.

WILLIAM BLACK AND AGNES MAIN

William, whose son Robert is, or was, a land steward about Inverness;

WILLIAM BLACK

William was born on 7 January 1815 at Leadloch in the parish of Whitburn.

William son to Robert Black and Jean Walker spouses in Leadloch was born 7 Jan 1805.

AGNES MAIN

Agnes's birth was not found but she was born about 1815 in Shotts, the daughter of Matthew Main and Marion Pettigrew.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

The couple were married on 6 January 1833 in Shotts when Agnes was around eighteen. They had four children, including Robert, their youngest child; the only one mentioned by JB.

The youngest and only son Robert was born after the census and Agnes died the following year and was buried on 25 August 1842 leaving three young children. In 1851 Jean and Robert were found living with their uncle, Matthew Main, in Shotts and despite being fifteen and eleven respectively, both were working; Robert being employed as a herd boy. Their grandmother Marion Pettigrew was also living in the household. Young Agnes on the other hand, in 1851 was living with her father in West Calder.

MARY CLARK

Mary Clark was born in Hamilton, Lanark in 1813. Her parents James Clark and Marion Hamilton then moved to Shotts where they farmed.



MARRIAGE

William and Mary Clark married in 1860 at Shotts. Mary was 47 but does not appear to have had a previous marriage. In 1861 the newlyweds were living at Handaxwood Crossroads, West Calder with William's unmarried daughter Agnes, who was now 27. In 1871 William and Mary had moved to Sheephouse Hill, Whitburn.

DEATH AND BURIAL

William died on 22 October 1872 and was given as 67 years of age.

The informant, Thomas Nimmo, had married William's daughter Agnes Black. Mary remarried in Fauldhouse in 1875. Her second husband, Andrew Grant Wark was also widowed. Mary died in 1901.

ROBERT BLACK AND BARBARA MONTGOMERY

There were seven sons ... **Robert**, who also was survived by a family...

ROBERT BLACK

Robert was born on 6 December 1806 in Whitburn.

Robert son to Robert Black and Jean Walker spouses in Leadloch was born 6 Dec 1806.

BARBARA MONTGOMERY

Barbara (whose surname was also spelt Montgomerie) was born on 10 September 1803 in Mearns, Renfrew. Her father was William Montgomery and her mother was Mary Gilmour. She appears to have had a child James Gilmour born about 1838 in Renfrew but no record is found of his birth to confirm this.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

Robert and Barbara married on 10 March 1844 in Gorbals, Glasgow. Robert was 37 and Barbara 40. Only one child was found.

In 1851 Robert and Barbara were living at 75 Dobbie Loan (still a street today) and Robert was described as a foundry carter.

The first James Black was later described as James Gilmour on the 1861 census and was at that point shown as Robert's stepson. The second James Black was Robert's half-brother. By 1861 fourteen-year-old Robert was absent from the household but Barbara's son James Gilmour was married and living with his stepfather. Had Robert died? It does seem likely as he was only fourteen in 1861, however JB did say that Robert and Barbara were survived by family and we can only find this one child.

DEATH AND BURIAL

Robert died on 13 December 1869 in Govanhill, Glasgow. Barbara then went to live with her sister's family in Renfrew and died in 1872 at Kilbarchan.

ALEXANDER BLACK, JANET SHANKS AND JANET MILLAR

Alexander, survived by family

ALEXANDER BLACK

Alexander was born on 14 February 1809 at Whitburn.

JANET SHANKS

Janet was born or baptised on 2 October 1814 in New Monkland to parents Robert Shanks and Agnes Hay.³

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

³ *Scotland's People* gives the parish as 'Airdire or New Monkland' This applies to all the records for this area.

The marriage, when Alexander was around 30 and Janet 25, took place on 1 August 1839 at New Monkland. Six children were located.

In 1841 Alexander was an agricultural labourer with his wife and baby Mary. By 1851, five more children had been born, but three had died.

We dispute the date of the next event as the Janet born in Airdrie on the 1851 census is clearly Janet Shanks. Just a few weeks after the census she must have died as Alexander then married a second but younger Janet. The date for this marriage on the indexes is 1 February 1851 (nine months before the above census in March) so we think the date of his second marriage is more correctly 1852.

JANET MILLAR

Janet Millar was born on 18 February 1820 St Quivox, Ayr. Her father was Charles and her mother Christian McDonald. She had previously been married to William Cook and on her marriage to Alexander bought her son William to live with her. Three children were found to Alexander and Janet Miller, the first who was named Alexander, was born it appears, the day after their marriage.

The 1861 census shows more children born and the absences highlight more deaths. For some reason, Alexander raised his age from the previous census by 14 years!

The baby Christina died aged one, the same year of the census.

DEATH AND BURIAL

Alexander died at Airdrie on 20 May 1869 at the recorded age of 60. Janet lived until the age of 93. She went to America with her sons William Cook and Alexander Black and died in Rhode Island on 7 June 1913.

JEAN (JANE) BLACK

Wallhill daughters were **Jean** ...

Jane was born on 12 April 1811. She never married and can be confirmed on only one census.

DEATH AND BURIAL

Jane died on 1 February 1882 in Edinburgh.

The informant was 'James Steel cousin', and this was probably the James born in 1826. He was correctly a first cousin once removed.

HELEN BLACK AND ALEXANDER STEVENSON

HELEN BLACK

Helen, a twin, born in 1815 was not found in 1841.

Helen and Agnes twin sisters, daughters to Robert Black and Jane Walker spouses in Wellhill born 30 Jul 1815.

She never described her birthplace as Whitburn which made her hard to confirm on census records.

ALEXANDER STEVENSON

Alexander was born about 1821 in Glasgow. His father was John Stevenson and his mother Janet Fullarton.

They married in May 1846 and their first child was born in November of the same year.

By 1871 they had returned to Old Monkland. Alexander was still a toll keeper.

DEATH AND BURIAL

Alexander died in 1881 and Helen in 1889 both in Old Monkland. Helen's father Robert was confirmed on her death certificate, but the name of her mother had not survived to the next generation.

Agnes, the other twin, was born on 30 July 1815, and she was the only one living at home with her father in 1841.

JAMES MCINTYRE

On the census, James claimed that he had been born around 1814 in Argyll but the actual parish changes with each census. We do think the birth below relates to him. In 1881 he gave Kilbride as his place of birth and naming patterns fits with this family.

Agnes died in 1892 in Fauldhouse aged 77. James as noted earlier, probably died in 1888 in the same place.



JAMES BLACK AND JANE COOPER

James, seventh Wallhill son, still living in Queensland, aged eighty-three years, being the only known representative of his own generation, and probably the oldest survivor among the Blacks of Breich Water.

JAMES BLACK

James was the only child of Robert Black and Margaret Thomson and was born in 1825 in Whitburn.

In 1841 he was probably the male servant at Braehead, Whitburn but by 1851 he was living with his half-brother Robert in Glasgow and working as a sewer's porter.

JANE COOPER

Jane was born about 1827 in Whitburn and was listed as being the daughter of Alexander Cooper and Margaret Black. We can't currently say if Margaret, her mother, was a Breich Water Black.

The couple married on 11 June 1852 at Carnwath and there were four possible children.
