
SON TWO - JOHN BLACK AND HELEN STEEL DESCENDANTS OF THEIR THIRD SON JAMES BLACK AND MARGARET NISBIT



Turnhigh Road is today south of Whitburn and north of Longridge. Burnside is not located. This map show: Back of Moss, Stonehead (Stanehead) and Rashierigg, another Black farm. The village of Longridge contained the church where many of the Blacks worshipped and whose records have been lost.

MEMORIES AND MELODIES PAGES 206-208

James, third Bushdyke son, had as his wife, Margaret Nesbit, and was tenant of Burnside, near Turnhigh Whitburn. There were three sons and five daughters.

John, married to Mary Grey, entered Back o' Moss in 1840. There were three sons, James, George, and John, and four daughters, Margaret, Agnes, Isabella, and Mary. James and his wife, both deceased, left two sons, John and James, and two daughters, Mary and Janet.

George, second Back o' Moss son, is farmer at Penston, East Lothian, his wife being Elizabeth Shanks, formerly of Turnhigh. They have four sons and one daughter.

John, the eldest son, is a clergyman in Kaffraria, while the other three are devoted to agricultural pursuits in East Lothian.

John, third Back o' Moss son, is still farmer there, he and his wife, Marion Mungall, having a family of sons and daughters.

It may be noted, in passing, that Mr James Walker, merchant, Bathgate, is a grandson of John Black, formerly of Back o' Moss, his mother being Agnes, wife of James Walker, Grahamston.

Thomas, second Burnside son, was married to Ann, daughter of John Russell, farmer, Foulshiels. Soon after the birth of their one daughter, the mother died, and a few years later the father was killed by the upsetting of his cart. The orphan girl was brought to Burnside, where she assisted her grandfather, and in course of years became Mrs John Sommerville. She is now in her widowhood, living with a son in Greenock. Another son is in Edinburgh, and there are also two daughters. It ought, in strict justice, to be told that much of the information in this history was gleaned by her during a lengthy lifetime, she being now over eighty years of age.

Alexander, third son of James, of Burnside, is highly entitled to very honourable mention, because, at the cost of his own, he saved the life of another man from drowning in the Forth near Stirling. His wife's name was Mary Galbraith. They had four sons and one daughter.

James, eldest, a baker in Glasgow, went with his family to Melbourne. He and his wife died in Dunedin several years ago. Alexander, second son, was formerly a tannery manager in London, afterwards going to Belgium. Peter, the third son, was a baker, and became a successful colonist. John, the youngest son, who had hard times in his youth, being orphaned when only four years of age, knew life as a herd-boy at Liltie-co-kee and at Craighead. He became a cooper, a musician, and, in manners and morals, a man worth knowing. With his family of sons and daughters he now lives in Glasgow. Janet, the hero's only daughter, with husband and family, went abroad, and worked themselves into comfortable circumstances.

Of the Burnside daughters, Agnes became Mrs Wm. Mungall, Helen became Mrs Peter Thornton, Rashiehill, and, in both cases, these families emigrated to America many years ago.

Margaret Thornton, Rashiehill, was married to Robert Thomson, Stonemains, near Knowton, and had several children. One son, Peter, lives in Whitburn, and another, James, lives in Bathgate. There are also several female descendants at various other places. Isabella Thornton was married to William Stark, Cambusnethan. Mary, of Burnside, was married to Robert Stewart, West Forth. A grand-daughter, Mrs Thomas Smith, resides in Rowantree Cottage, Cambuslang. Janet became Mrs Wm. Macgregor, and Jane Mrs David Roberts, Burnbrae.


JAMES BLACK AND MARGARET NISBIT

JAMES BLACK


James was baptised on 8 November 1761 in West Calder.

Margaret's birth at West Calder on 10 July 1763 showed the spelling Nisbit. Her father was Alexander and her mother Elizabeth Weir.




Parish baptism records - West Calder, Midlothian.

JB referred to her as Nesbit and her descendants used both variations when naming their children.

The last two were twins. Although only Alexander's birth is recorded on *Scotland's People*, Jean's date of birth was recorded on her headstone.

We are unaware when James and Margaret went to Burnside, as indicated by JB, but James's tenancy was confirmed in the Whitburn parish records of 1834, where he was recorded as the head of household, and also on the 1841 census. If you read JB's extract, you will have seen their granddaughter Ann Black went to live with her grandfather and confirmation is found below. Also living in the house that night was Janet Stewart, another granddaughter. As can be seen, James's wife Margaret had died by 1841 but we have no further information about her death.

AGNES BLACK

Agnes was born about 1791 in Whitburn, a date established from the census.

WILLIAM MUNGLE

Mungle has various spellings. William was baptised on 12 November 1797 at Bathgate to parents Joseph Mungle and Janet Graham.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

The couple married on 7 May 1815 at Livingston; William was seven years younger than Agnes. There were eight possible children.

Two years later they sailed for America and arrived in New York on 30 May 1853. All of their children eventually immigrated except for Joseph who died in 1845 however his daughter Marion later married into the Black family.

DEATH AND BURIAL

Both William and Mary died in New York State in 1868.

HELEN BLACK

Helen was born about 1795 at Burnside in Whitburn. She was recorded as Helen on her marriage and Hellen on her death.

PETER THORNTON



An *Ancestry* tree shows Peter was born on 10 October 1786 in Whitburn to Patrick Thornton and Ann Agnes Smith, however the census record shows he was born in West Calder. No birth was found on *Scotland's People* for either location.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

The marriage was on 4 June 1815 at Shotts. Their children's baptisms were not found on *Scotland's People*, so we assume these dates come from family knowledge. It appears from the census records that the children were all born in Cambusnethan except Margaret the eldest.³

Most of the Thornton family then slowly immigrated to America. Their son Peter went first in 1849, then William in 1853 followed by Peter and Helen themselves in 1856 and they were accompanied on the voyage by their son John and his wife Ann.

Interestingly we found another son James from the Whitburn burial records and the headstone reads: *Erected by Peter THORNTON & wife Helen BLACK in memory of son James* 25.5.1844 24, and to mark a burying place for Thomas

THORNTON joiner Longridge. Thomas died in Christchurch, New Zealand in 1889, years after his parents had died.

JOHN BLACK AND MARY GRAY

Residence - Back-o-Moss, Whitburn

... **John,** married to **Mary Grey**, entered Back o' Moss in 1840. There were three sons, James, George, and John, and four daughters, Margaret, Agnes, Isabella, and Mary.

JOHN BLACK

John was born on 19 August 1797 at Burnside, Whitburn.

John Black son to James Black and Margaret Nisbit spouses in Burnside was born 19 August 1797.

MARY GRAY

Mary was the daughter of George Grey and Margaret Tenant and was born around 1800 in Dalserf, Lanarkshire.

Marriage and Children

The pair married on 5 June 1824 in Whitburn. Their daughter Agnes's marriage in 1855 gave us a clue as to where the family first lived in Whitburn and that was a farm called Cult near Back of Moss. They assumed the lease on Back of Moss in 1840 and as both properties were close to Longridge, all the baptisms would have been entered into these registers which are lost.

Mary lived for another twenty years and died on 10 March 1893 aged 93. John was buried in Whitburn and we assume Mary was also.

JANET BLACK AND WILLIAM McGREGOR

JANET BLACK

Janet's birth has been estimated as 1799 at Burnside.

WILLIAM McGREGOR

A tree gives Williams' birth as 14 June 1807.

MARRIAGE

Janet and William married at Whitburn on 1 March 1828. A family tree has them going to Quebec, in 1834 and William remarrying there in 1839. It appears they had no surviving children and Janet; therefore we assume, died in Quebec around 1838.

MARY BLACK AND ROBERT STEWART

Mary, of Burnside, was married to Robert Stewart, West Forth.

MARY BLACK

Mary was born about 1801 at Whitburn.

ROBERT STEWART

Robert, a cattle dealer from West Forth was born on 13 October 1779 in Stonehouse Lanarkshire to parents John Stewart and Agnes Ferguson.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

Robert was 45 and Mary 22 when they married at Whitburn on 6 December 1823.

By 1841 there were three children living at home; John aged eight (and based on that, the first John must have died), Jean aged five and Mary aged two. The eldest daughter Janet was living with her grandfather James Black. Agnes the youngest child told her family that her father had enlisted with the army and the family often didn't know where the next meal was coming from while he was away but as he was present in 1841 we are not sure what period this relates to.

The 1851 census shows Robert had died and we can see a further child Agnes, aged nine, had been born to the couple The only other child at home, besides Agnes, was Mary, who was now twelve.

DEATH AND BURIAL

Robert was buried at Carnwath on 12 March 1851, just before the census. He was 73. The inscription reads: *Erected by Hugh Stewart in memory of his father Robert Stewart*, *died at Forth 10 March 1851 aged 72 years*.'.

A tree on *Ancestry* tells us that Mary decided to leave for Canada and travelled in 1856 accompanied by four of her children. Margaret (now Mrs William Ramage) Hugh, John and Agnes. Mary never saw the shores of Canada as she died on the voyage and was buried at sea. Only two daughters remained in Scotland.

⁵ It is thought that Mary's second to youngest daughter (also Mary) was on the ship as well. She certainly married in Canada in 1863. It is possible she was listed as a married woman on the passenger list. and travelling under a different name. but we have no evidence about this.

THOMAS BLACK

Thomas was born at Burnside on 6 September 1802.

Thomas Black son to James Black and Margaret Nisbit spouses in Burnside was born 6 Sept 1802.

ANN RUSSELL

Annie as she was sometimes recorded was born on around 1802; her father John Russell was from Foulshiels. Various properties named Foulshiels can be seen on the map between Whitburn and Stoneyburn.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

We find the marriage on 1 January 1825 at Whitburn. Their daughter Ann's birth is not found but it is estimated as late 1825, as in January 1826, we find her mother's burial at Whitburn.



Alexander was born on 26 December 1805 at Whitburn, a twin to Jane.




Parish baptism records - Whitburn, West Lothian.


The marriage took place on 3 June 1827 at St Ninians, Stirling.

Initially we thought Mary had died around 1834 and Alexander had remarried around 1838 to a Janet, instead the gap between the children's birth years and the naming of Alexander's wife as Janet on the 1841 census, must have another explanation. In 1841 Alexander was a carter and they were living at Mill Lane Cowane Street.

DEATH AND BURIAL

JB claimed that Alexander drowned in the Forth when his son John was four. Although a newspaper account was not found, Alexander was described on one daughter's marriage certificate as a 'ship owner's carter,' so we can picture him at the waterfront loading and unloading ships. If John was four, Alexander drowned around 1850, purportedly 'because, at the cost of his own, he saved the life of another man from drowning in the Forth near Stirling'. We know from a second daughter's marriage that the event had occurred before 7 September 1850, as he was described as deceased when the banns were recorded.

As the only burial on *Scotland's People* in 1850 is for a seven-year-old, we have no exact date for his death and if his body was washed out to sea, no burial record would exist.

Alexander's wife Mary must have died around the same time as by 1851 the children were living apart. As JB mentions them individually, their story continues later.

JEAN (JANE) BLACK AND DAVID ROBERTS

JEAN (JANE) BLACK

Jane, Alexander's twin was born at Burnside on 26 December 1805.

DAVID ROBERTS

David was the son of David Roberts and Elizabeth Thomson and born on 31 July 1803 in Bathgate.


Their marriage was not found but it took place before 1841 as they are on the census together that year.

Only one child was found and in 1851 they were living on a farm of twelve acres called Badweather. By the time of the 1861 census the family had emigrated to Wisconsin.

DEATH AND BURIAL

Jane died in 1893 in Wisconsin; David had died there in 1876.



Both Jane and David are buried in the Indian Farm Cemetery Durwards Glen, Columbia County, Wisconsin.

Margaret was born around 1817 at Whitburn. Her parents immigrated to America after she married.

ROBERT THOMSON

Robert, whose parents were likely to be James Thomson and Jane Johnstone, was born around 1822 at Hillhead, Lanarkshire. He varied his place of birth on each census so we cannot be certain of these details.



By 1871 there were twelve people in the house including children and grandchildren from William's first marriage. Margaret was born about 1842 in Whitburn. Her mother was Janet Meek, and her father was unnamed.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

Margaret was fifteen years younger than James. The couple married on 29 November 1872. Exactly as JB said, we found the four children he had named.

(Burnside was the home of her grandparents James Black and Margaret Nisbet – the couple that this chapter is about, and they had moved to Blackburn, Livingston by 1861.)

WILLIAM HAMILTON

William was born in Antrim, Ireland around 1838.



ANN BLACK AND JOHN SOMMERVILLE

The orphan girl was brought to Burnside, where she assisted her grandfather, and in course of years became **Mrs John Sommerville**. She is now in her widowhood, living with a son in Greenock. Another son is in Edinburgh, and there are also two daughters. It ought, in strict justice, to be told that much of the information in this history was gleaned by her during a lengthy lifetime, she being now over eighty years of age.

ANN BLACK

Ann Black was orphaned soon after she was born (around 1825); her mother probably died as a result of childbirth and her father died soon after. We now realise that she remained in contact with her maternal grandfather John Russell, and Ann's son Ebenezer was probably named after John Russell's son from a second marriage. Ann's daughter Mary was living with John Russell (her great-grandfather) in 1871 in Bathgate.

JOHN SOMMERVILLE

John was born or baptised on 6 January 1812 in Cambusnethan, William Sommerville and Mary Lowden being his parents.

WHITBURN. THE LATE MES SOMMERVILLE

A MEMORIAL TRIBUTE.

Early last week Mrs John Sommerville, aged 89 years, passed away in the home of her daughter, Mrs Belcher, near Kilsyth. Having lived latterly for many years with her son, Andrew, an herbalist in Greenock, she was probably less known in this part of the country than she had been during most of her previous existence. Still, now and again, even when well advanced in years, she occasionally made lengthy summer visits to the parishes of Whitbarn, Bathgate, Shotts, and latterly to West Calder, near which place, at Little Harwood, she stayed in the house of her cousin, John Black, formerly of Back o' Moss, Longridge. Mr Walker, grocer, Bathgate, being a cousin's son, also received frequent visits from Mrs Sommerville, when on her pligrimages throughout her native district. Her father, Thomas Black, was married to Ann Russell, of Foulshields Farm, and either there, or quite near, their only child, Ann, was born. Being early orphaned she was taken to the home of her grandfather, Robert Black, at Burnside Farm. The homestead has completed disappeared, but the place where it stood is only a short distance from the farm house of Turnhigh. When advanced to womanhood Ann Black, became Mrs Sommerville, and by either of these names has been known and esteemed by those who knew her during the intervening time. There were several sons and daughters of the marriage, most of whom survive their parents, for Mr Sommerville predeceased his wife many years ago. Her health was always remarkable, and her equanimity of spirits was doubtless favourable to long-evity.

of the good old Scottish peasantry; plain, thrifty, and intelligent. She was fond of reading, a good observer, and one who pondered well over what she saw and learned. Further she was a woman sincerely devout, and until the close of her long life-time was austained and comforted by her Christian faith.

She was homely, genial, and withal possessed of a quiet dignity, which added a comeliness to her serenity of countenance. Like not a few of the old-time Brotswomen, she was skilled in the uses of herbs and "simples" as aids to health, and as remedial agents, and with these she accomplished

much good work.

For a considerable time she has been the oldest representative of the "Blacks of Breich Water district," and as was told in the outline history of these Blacks, to her careful effort and remarkable memory was largely due the information given by her kinsman, John Black, author of "Melodies and Memories."

The funeral of Mrs Sommerville took place at Kilsyth on Friday of last week, and it may be added that those who knew her well will still remember kindly the calm, sensible old friend, and her simple, wholesome life. If not among the so-called "great," she was certainly one of the worthy "little ones."


James was born about 1828 in Stirling. As stated by JB, James was a baker and by 1850 he had moved to Glasgow.

The marriage took place in Barony, Glasgow on 23 July 1850.




Parish marriage records - Barony, Glasgow, Lanark.

MARGARET BLACK AND ARTHUR LIDDELL

Janet, [wasn't] the hero's only daughter

It seems unfair to omit Margaret from this story because JB was unaware of her existence so we are righting this wrong so that the other hero's other daughter is not forgotten.

MARGARET BLACK

Margaret, born around 1831, appeared on the 1841 census aged ten along with the rest of her family.

ARTHUR LIDDELL

Arthur was around ten years older than Margaret. He was born, he claims, in Glasgow about 1823 to parents Arthur Liddell and Kate but no record exists. Arthur was recorded on the 1841 census as a tartan hand loom weaver apprentice in Stirling.

The actual marriage appears to have occurred on 23 September; a date given by Arthur on five separate occasions but what is more significant, is that from this record we know Alexander had died by 7 September 1850.

Twelve children were located and sadly many died before they were one. The spelling varies from Liddell, Liddel and Liddle.

ALEXANDER BLACK AND SARAH WOODS

Alexander, second son, was formerly a tannery manager in London, afterwards going to Belgium.

ALEXANDER BLACK

Alexander was born about 1833 in Stirling. By 1851, he was living with the Hardie family in Stirling; his occupation was currier's apprentice. His choice of career gave him a lifelong employment in the leather industry, leading him to employment in London and later Belgium. All the English census records confirm that Alexander was a tannery manager, and by all accounts a highly successful one.

SARAH WOODS

Sarah, daughter of James Woods and Jane Elson was baptised on 26 June 1838 in Surrey, England.

DEATH AND BURIAL

Alexander's death, before 1911 cannot be identified as his name is too common and we are not even sure if he died in England. Sarah may have died in 1917.

PETER BLACK

Peter, the third son, was a baker, and became a successful colonist.

Nothing can be found of Peter after 1851 when he was twelve and an apprentice baker living with his brother in Glasgow. Which colony he emigrated to is not yet known. He probably left Scotland before 1861.

JANET CAMERON BLACK AND JOHN WRIGHT GILMOUR

Janet, the hero's only daughter, with husband and family, went abroad, and worked themselves into comfortable circumstances.

A tree on *Ancestry* tells us that Janet was born on 13 November 1841 in Stirling but as she appeared on the 1841 census aged one, perhaps this should read 13 November 1839. By September 1850, her father had died and the following year she was living with John Aitken's family, working as a servant. John was a shipowner and we surmise he was her father's employer before he died. She is recorded as fourteen but would have been eleven.



1851 census – Stirling, Stirlingshire.


By 1861 Janet had moved to Glasgow were she was working as a servant for the Russell family.

JOHN WRIGHT GILMOUR

John, who later added his mother's surname as his middle name was born on 8 December 1840 in Glasgow. His mother was Elizabeth Wright and his father John Gilmour. We met John earlier in our story; he was the John Gilmour living with James Black in 1841. His mother Elizabeth Wright had married John Little and their daughter Mary married Janet's brother James Black. On the death of John Little, Elizabeth married John Gilmour and their son (also John) was living with three of Janet Black's siblings in 1841. John was an iron turner.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

In a case of siblings marrying (half) siblings, Janet Black married John Gilmour on 18 November 1864 at Tradeston, Glasgow.

DEATH AND BURIAL

John died on 15 July 1908 and Janet on 7 August 1920. They were buried in the Northern Cemetery with their baby son who died in 1884, and other family members.

JOHN BLACK, MARY SLOAN AND MARGARET MCINDEWAR

John, the youngest son, who had hard times in his youth, being orphaned when only four years of age, knew life as a herd-boy at Liltie-co-kee and at Craighead. He became a cooper, a musician, and, in manners and morals, a man worth knowing. With his family of sons and daughters he now lives in Glasgow.



JOHN BLACK

John was born about 1846 in Stirling. Both his parents had died before he was five. Initially he was raised by his oldest brother James but when James emigrated to Australia, John went to 'The Breich' perhaps initially to family, but in 1861 he was living on a large farm looking after cows. He later trained as a cooper just as JB stated.





We last found James in Scotland in 1901 when he was fifteen, and he later claimed on the American census, to have immigrated in 1902 where he settled in Philadelphia.

ANNA FIRTH

Annie (as she was known) was ten years older having been born in the States in 1876 to Richard Firth and his wife Amanda Blythe.

MARRIAGE

James and Annie married around 1905 when they were 20 and 30, respectively. James, a carpenter, naturalised in 1907. They had no apparent children.

DEATH AND BURIAL

Annie died in 1959 and James in 1961.

ANN SOMMERVILLE

The orphan girl ... became Mrs John Sommerville... there are also two daughters [Ann].

JB stated that Ann Black had two daughters alive in 1909 so Ann, born in 1850, who cannot be traced after 1851, must have been alive and married but we cannot find her.

THOMAS SOMMERVILLE AND AGNES WILSON

The orphan girl ... became Mrs John Sommerville. ... Another son [Thomas] is in Edinburgh.

THOMAS SOMERVILLE

Thomas was one month old in the 1851 census, so we have recorded his birthdate as March 1851. He worked as a mason and lived in Edinburgh all his adult life.

AGNES WILSON

Agnes, the daughter of John Wilson and Janet Stewart, was born in Dalmeny on 10 February 1854.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

Thomas and Agnes married in Edinburgh in 1879. Four children survived but with a five-year gap there was likely another.

MARY SOMMERVILLE

Mary's birth around 1853 in Shotts, is not located but in 1871 she was a dressmaker and boarding with her great grandfather, John Russell in Bathgate.

JOHN AITCHISON

We only know the name of John's mother, Janet Beveridge and have guessed his birth around 1847.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

John and Mary married in 1875 in Calderhead, Shotts and John died soon after. Their daughter was born after his death.


A year after he was widowed, John married Mary Sommerville, and the following year, Mary gave birth to twins. We found seven children altogether.

Andrew was born on 12 August 1855 in Shotts. He consistently lived with his mother as did his brother Ebenezer and in 1901 they were living in Greenock West. Andrew was a medical herbalist and Ebenezer a house joiner. Ebenezer went to America in 1901 and married there. Andrew remained single.

DEATH AND BURIAL

Andrew died on 23 May 1932 in Dunoon, Argyll. The informant was David Murray. His older sister Mary had a daughter Annie Black Aitchison and she had married David Murray. David was therefore a nephew-in-law.
