John Black (JB) is who we have to thank for Melodies and Memories, so it was a surprise to find this man with occupations such as engineer's labourer, joiner and then an outfitter and jeweller.

Writing poetry was obviously his hobby.

William, eldest Bushdyke son, farmed first at Westburn, and next at Blackburn, whither he moved about 1800. His wife, Jane Cleland, became the mother of three sons and five daughters, viz., John, William, and James, Margaret, Helen, Janet, Agnes, and Elizabeth, who went to Canada, and died there a few years ago. Mrs James Forbes, a daughter of Helen, is now living in Carluke.

William having died, through being thrown from one of his carts, his son John, a quaint, typical Scot, succeeded him at Blackburn, and was married to his cousin, Agnes Black, Starrishaw. To this couple were born, at Blackburn - four daughters - Janet, Agnes, Margaret, and Elizabeth, the two latter still living; while at Craighead, where they removed to, two sons - William and Richard, were born.

John, one winter evening, had been enjoying a warm drink, that delighted and greatly benefitted him. After he was done stining, sipping, and slowly swallowing, he signified his high approval by saying, "Tat's gude, uncommon gude, it's amazin' some folk's sae keen o' whisky."

William, married to Janet Robb, Haywood Mains, was afterwards farmer at Fauldhouse, and now at Leadloch They have three sons - John, James, and William, also seven daughters - Mary, Agnes, Margaret, Janet, Elizabeth, Annie, and Dinah, the latter being the only one in the family unmarried.

This so-called history being mainly to trace the male line of descent and branches, the female line will be indicated very briefly.

John, eldest Leadloch son, is farmer of Roberton Mains, Dolphinton, and his eldest son, William, now twenty years of age, is senior member of the seventh generation of the Blacks of Breich Water.

James, second Leadloch son, with wife and family occupy the farm of Fauldhouse, formerly tenanted by his father.

William, third son, has been several years at Boksburg, South Africa.

Richard, second son of John of Craighead, lives with wife and family at East Whitburn. John, the eldest son, is about twenty years of age, the other sons being Walter Annan, and Richard. There are two daughters one married and one unmarried.

William, second son of William of Westburn, was born there in 1797. About 1830 he became tenant of East Handaxwood, which he retained with credit for full fifty years. He was married in 1833 to Elizabeth, daughter of Alexander Smith, and died in 1884.

William used to rehearse now and again that in ancient lawless times bands of wandering reivers went hither and thither over the countryside, living by the way on the sometimes scanty food supplies of industrious crofters or small farmers. Coming to a lonely dwelling one day, not far from Drumley Water, the usual demand for something to eat and drink was made. The gudewife set out a goodly pile of oaten faris, the heel of a kebbuck, and plenty of clear spring water, telling her unwelcome visitors that she could do no more for them. "Ye hae some kye," said the leader, "Whaur's the milk, is't in the kirn here?" and forthwith the appetising lapped milk, nearly ready for churning, was soon disappearing, much to the regret of the thrifty

gudewife. The gudeman, being at home, joined in the feast with the marauders, though the glum looks of his wife were often turned his way. When oatcakes, cheese, and milk were exhausted, husband and wife were left alone. "Sic a vexation," said the woman, "an' what made it waur was your takin' pairt wi' them, an' helpin' to tim my kirn." "Wheesht, wheesht, my wifie, I'll no be hungry the day again, I thocht it best to hae a share, for I saw it was gaun gear onywey."

At Handaxwood, four sons, William, Alexander, John, and James were born, also eight daughters.

William was farmer at Falla Hill, and next at Couch, until his death in 1894. To him and his wife, Isabella Fleming, were born four sons, William, John, Alexander, and James, also four daughters, of whom only the eldest, Mrs J. S. Waddell, is now alive, having one son and two daughters.

William, eldest son, having died in youth, John, second son, became his father's successor, and, with his wife, daughter, and son, live on the banks of Almond Water, near Polkemmet.

James, his wife, and daughters, live in Denver, USA.

Alexander, second East Handaxwood son, at thirty-three years of age, and unmarried, met his death in 1873 on the C.R. railway at Holytown (old station) while acting as Relief Inspector.

John, third son of William, of East Handaxwood, with one daughter and one surviving son, reside in Glasgow. By means of his verses in local newspapers, he has directed not a little attention to his native district, to which he is ardently attached.

James, fourth East Handaxwood son, with his wife and two daughters, live at Woodfords, near Portland, Maine, U.S.A., and he too still cherishes a warm regard for the friends and scenes of life's earlier years.

The East Handaxwood daughters were Agnes, Jane, Elizabeth, Mary, Margaret, Janet Helen, Catherine Jemima Ronaldson, and Christina. With the exception of Mary, all were married, and their descendants count up to a goodly total, there being, besides several grandchildren, at least one great-grandchild.

Only the youngest of those daughters continues to live near Breich Water side. Truly, time works changes!

James, third Westburn, or Backburn, son, married Margaret Prentice. After being some time at Backburn and at Addiewell, he spent the remainder of his years at Turniemoon, near West Calder.

The author remembers hearing of James, his uncle, having been talking of the new cemetery at West Calder as his probable burying place, although he considered he had a claim to a lair in the older burying ground beside the old Church. Waxing warm regarding his rights, he declared emphatically that he could force himself into the auld Kirkyard in spite o' a' wha would seek to hinder." This way of putting the statement caused some merriment in those who were listening, though, of course, they dare not laugh outright.

William and John were the sons of the family, the six daughters being Janet, Jane, Margaret, Agnes, Elizabeth, Helen, all of whom were married. Two of the number are still wonderfully hale, the others being now deceased.

William died some years ago, survived by four sons James, William, David, John. John, second son of James, of Turniemoon, lives in Broxburn; also his three sons, James, John, and David.

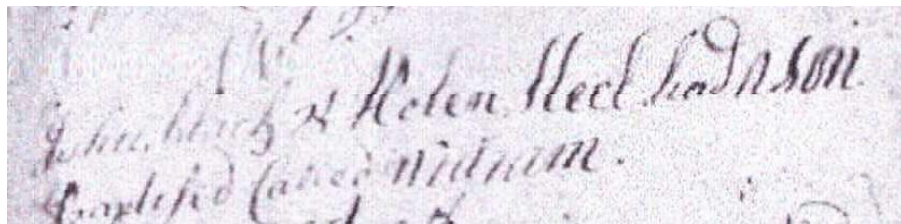

WILLIAM BLACK

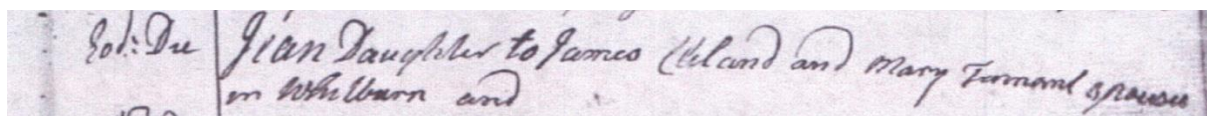
William was baptised on 2 October 1757 at West Calder; we assume at Bushdyke.

JEAN CLELAND

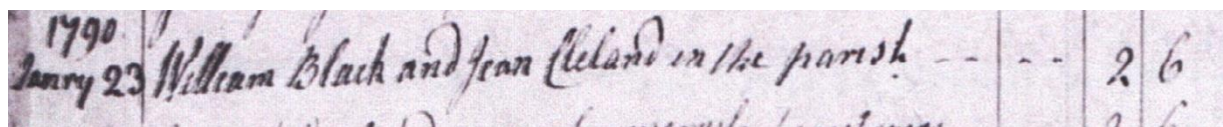
Jean, on the 1841 census, said she was born in Midlothian but a baptism on 24 March 1771 in Whitburn is likely to be her. Her parents therefore were James Cleland and Mary Tennant. The only reference to her as Jane was by JB.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

William married Jean Cleland in Whitburn on 23 January 1790. If we are correct, he was 32 and she was only 18.

Their first child's birth, Elizabeth was not located, and their second John was baptised in Whitburn, but born at Westburn in West Calder.

Westburn is no longer an obvious property, but indications are it was near Addiewell. JB claimed William and Jean then moved to Blackburn around 1811 but this was a typo and should read Backburn, a 'small farm consisting of about 70 acres of arable land with outhouses & dwelling house in tolerable repair it is occupied by Mr Black and the property of Mr Haer.'¹ On William's death, the farm was taken over by his eldest son John who had married Agnes Black. When John later acquired his own holding, his mother remained behind, and the third son James took over Backburn.

In 1841, Jean and her two daughters were living in one household and son James and his family were shown as a separate household. James is the Mr Black referred to above.

DEATH AND BURIAL

William death before 1841, which we learn was from having 'being thrown from one of his carts', was not located and that year Jean was found living with her two youngest daughters. Her death is recorded on an *Ancestry* tree in 1842 but we have no evidence of this. We assume she and William were buried in West Calder.


JOHN BLACK

John was born to William and Jean Cleland in 1791 and baptised at Whitburn.

John son of William Black and Jane Cleland spouses of Westburn, Parish of West Calder was born 1791 and baptised 20 August same year.²

AGNES BLACK

Agnes was the daughter of Richard Black and Jane Samuels and born on 18 August 1801 and baptised on 22 August at Starryslaw, Shotts.

and baptized.

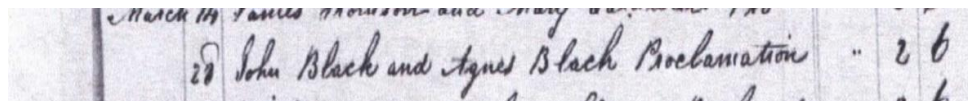

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

John and Agnes were more correctly second cousins and their proclamation of marriage was recorded on 28 March 1824 at Shotts. Agnes was ten years younger.

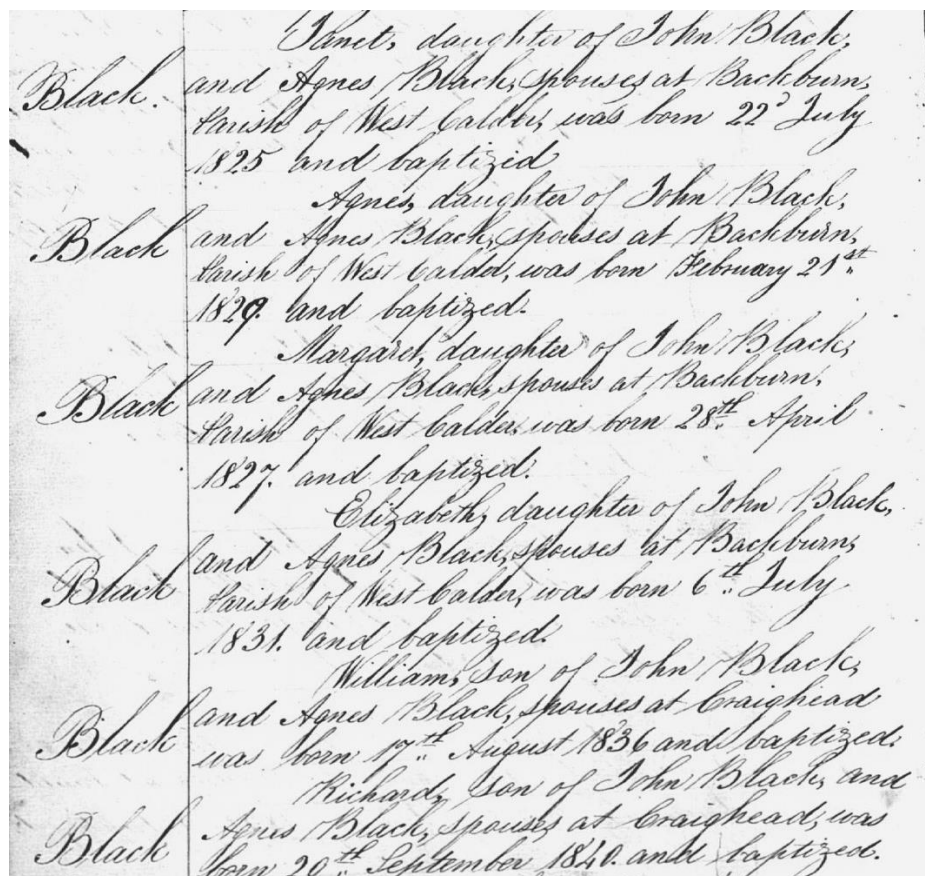


Parish marriage records - Shotts, Lanark.

The six children mentioned by JB were all recorded in the Whitburn parish in 1852 appearing that they were all 'baptised' on the same day. The eldest children were by then in their twenties. The record correctly denotes the change in residence between the birth of Elizabeth in 1831 and William in 1836.

Margaret, baptised on 28 April 1793, is also a mystery, John clearly knew about her but failed to name who she married. A proclamation on 15 December 1822 in West Calder is a possibility but we can find no children to the couple.

HELEN BLACK

Helen was born abt 1795 in West Calder.

JOHN THOMSON

John was born around 1794 but not in Midlothian.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

We now realise that two Helen Blacks of a similar age married a John Thomson both in West Calder, but only this marriage was found and possibly none of their children were baptised. We only know of one child.

By 1841, John was living at East Handaxwood with only his thirteen year old daughter Jane, also in the home. East Handaxwood was the home of his brother-in-law, William Black.

WILLIAM BLACK

William was the father of John Black, the writer of *Melodies and Memories*. JB claimed his father was born in 1797 so we assume 13 May 1798 was his baptism date. Before he married, William became a tenant farmer at East Handaxwood, a short distance from his great grandfather's farm at Lilti-co-kee and his grandfather's farm at Bushdyke. The property's previous name was Easter Handaxwood.

ELIZABETH SMITH



Scotland's People shows Elizabeth, with no middle name, but it is sometimes given as McConachie. She was baptised on 1 January 1812 at Whitburn the daughter of Alexander Smith and Agnes Muir.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

The couple married on 8 December 1833 when William was 36 and Elizabeth 21. A later document records the location as Breich Inns, West Calder. They had twelve children.

The ordinance survey books tell us the property was occupied by William Black and was around 50 acres, the property of Mr Haer (who may have been the factor). By 1861 we can see William was leasing 100 acres.

Despite showing his occupation as retired farmer, William was still living at East Handaxwood in 1881. He was the farmer who was accused of watering his milk and a report was found in the *Edinburgh Evening News*, 25 August 1880 confirming this.

William Black, dairyman, Handaxwood, West Calder, was fined 5s and costs, with the alternative of one week's imprisonment, for having in his possession a beam and scales 2½ ounces off the balance against the purchaser, and also three small milk measures which were un-stamped.—James Wiseman, dairyman, Rashie-

The couple were married for over 50 years and JB wrote in the West Lothian Courier dated 31 December 1920 of the event – an extract of the article follows.

An event of this kind being altogether unusual, even in more populous communities, to have one here may be counted a feather in the cap of our outlying district in the moors. Moreover, Mr and Mrs Black having numerous descendants and friends in various countrysides, the matter is one of almost public interest. Their united ages count to 165.

As was told ten years ago, when the golden wedding was fittingly observed, Mr and Mrs Black were wed in the home of her aged father, Mr James Robb, Upper Haywood Farm, by Rev. Mr Banks, Braehead (now deceased), on December 28th, 1860. Mr Black's father was John of Craighead, a great-grandson of John of Busdyke, one of the first of the Blacks of Breich Water district, over 200 years ago. At Robertson Mains, where John, eldest son, now deceased, resided, are male and female representatives of the family; also at Fauldhouse Farm, James, with wife and family; and presently the youngest son of the elderly couple, William, is with his wife home on a visit from South Africa, and so affording much pleasure to all. The daughters—all married—are Mrs Russell, Mossie Farm; Mrs Mackie, Smithston; Mrs Neilson, Legbrannock; Mrs Scobie, Waterlands; Mrs Buchanan, Craigdonald, Coatbridge; Mrs Robb, Mosshall; and Mrs Hunter, Shirrel.

Excepting Mr Buchanan, the husbands are all farmers, and in all of the homes represented Mr and Mrs Black have grandchildren, a few of whom, also a few great-grand-children, have arrived since the golden wedding celebration, so that now the combined number is 43.

The aged friends were cordially congratulated on the noteworthy occasion, and a profusion of kind wishes expressed on their behalf by all.

The Chairman was cordially thanked, and the company duly dispersed towards their widely-spread homes with a plethora of pleasant memories. Mrs Gibson, Longridge; Miss Ogilvie and Drs. Ogilvie and Gilchrist, Fauldhouse were among those who were present at the large and delightful family function.

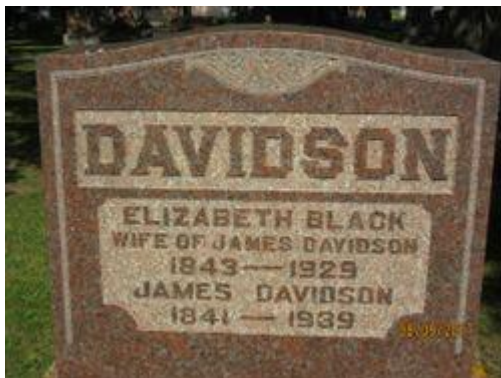

JOHN BLACK

It is this John Black who we have to thank for *Melodies and Memories* so it was a surprise to find this man with occupations such as farm labourer, engineer's labourer, joiner and then an outfitter and jeweller. Writing poetry was obviously a hobby. He didn't make it obvious that he was writing about himself and didn't name his wife or children in his writings. He was born in December 1849. And we have found also the following extract detailing his life.

JOHN BLACK, author of many poems and prose sketches, came upon the stage of life just as the year of grace 1849 was drawing to a close. He is the eighth of a family of four sons and eight daughters, who were brought up at the farm of East Handaxwood, in Calder Parish, and near Fauldhouse, Linlithgowshire, the district which, as *Bentybrae*, he has sung and depicted with tenderness and fidelity. Mr Black comes of a rhyming family, one of his brothers and two of his sisters being capable of expressing their thoughts in verse. When about twenty-three years of age, Mr Black commenced to contribute to the poet's corner of various newspapers and magazines. A large number of his pieces have appeared in *The Hamilton Advertiser*. After residing twelve years at Addiewell, Mr Black, with his wife and family, moved westward, exchanging a home on the banks of the Breich for one on the banks of the Kelvin. Stalwart in physique, and upright in character, with a warm underglow of genial sentiment, Mr Black is indeed a typical Scot, and worthy the esteem in which he is held by a wide circle of acquaintances and friends.

AGNES JOHNSTON

Agnes the daughter of Clement Johnston and Mary Wilson was born on 21 September 1848 in Stirling.

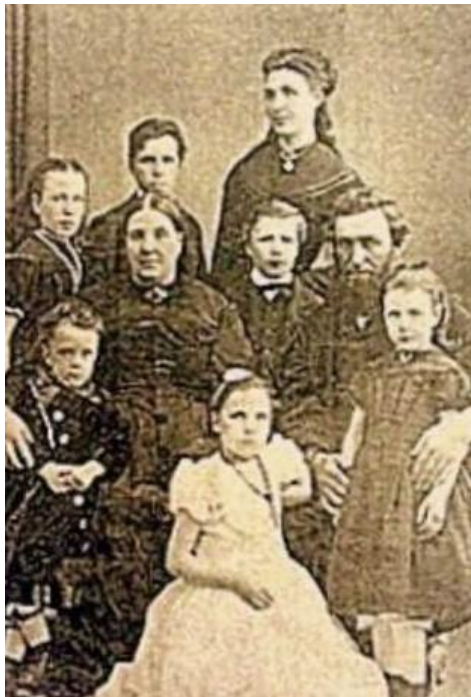

By 1861 there was no sign of John and Margaret living together and Daniel and Thomas were still living with James Black their grandfather. By 1871 the couple were together at Mid Calder but their children were not in the house; instead, we find Margaret caring for her niece Jessie Rennie Black.

DEATH AND BURIAL

Margaret died on 8 April 1878 at Dunbar.



On the 8th inst., at Bieldside East Lodge, Dunbar, MARGARET BLACK, wife of JOHN M'FARLANE, and third daughter of James Black, Coxydean, late of Turniemoon, West Calder. Friends omitted please accept this intimation.

Soon after, John married again. He and his second wife Jemima Robb had five children. His death after 1891 is unknown.

The two sons, both born out of wedlock, chose to use different surnames; Daniel Black and Thomas McFarlane were, it seems full brothers. In 1881 they and their families were all living at 62 Grassmarket, Edinburgh, so despite choosing differing names the brothers were close.

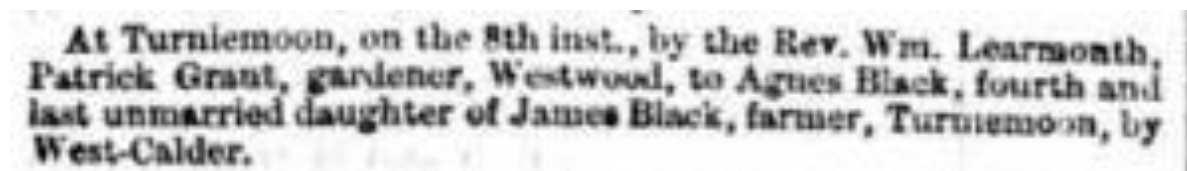
In 1871, young Janet was recorded by the enumerator as Janet Rennie rather than Janet Black and she was living with her Aunt Margaret McFarlane. By 1881 Jane, now known as Jessie Grant, was living with her Aunt Jane Lockerbie and she remained with this family until 1891 when she was recorded as a 28-year-old dressmaker.

PATRICK GRANT

Patrick consistently gave his birthplace as Aberlour, Banffshire, but not his birthdate. One tree identifies his birth on 7 November 1807 in Aberlour and it is likely he had been married previously.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

Agnes and Patrick married on 8 April 1869 at West Calder when Patrick was around the age of 61 and Agnes 34.

They don't appear to have had any children.

DEATH AND BURIAL

Agnes died on 1 May 1908 and Patrick in 1894. They were buried at West Calder. It is noticeable that the headstone states 'In ever loving memory of my mother' but the daughter's name isn't mentioned. Janet Rennie Black never appeared to have lived with her mother Agnes Grant, and by the time of Agnes's death she was married and living in England.

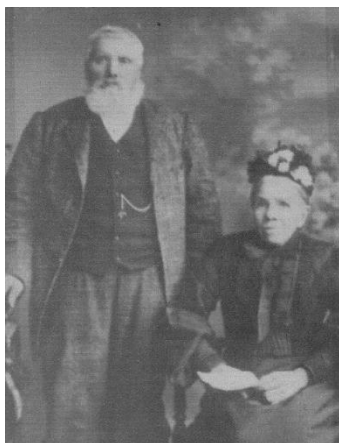

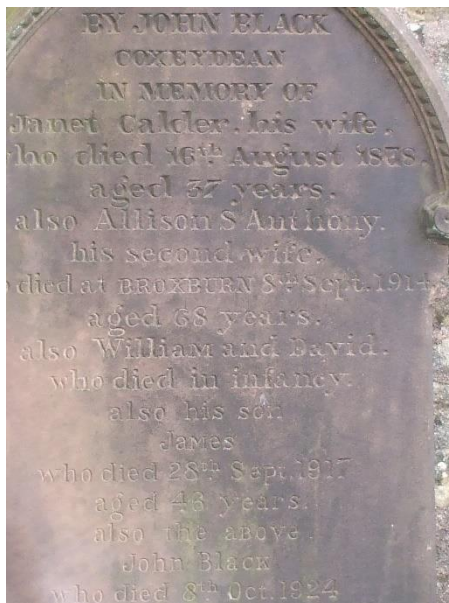
