Alexander, married to Grace Russell, was owner and occupier of Blackfaulds. Even in those primitive days some were rich and some not so rich. Their sons were William, of Bents, and Alexander, of Woodmuir. Janet Cunningham was wife of the former, and Jane Russell was Alexander's wife. At Bents Farm there were three sons and five daughters. Alexander died young. William married Miss Gray, Whiteside, and, presumably, was farmer at Hartwood, West Calder.

John, third Bents son, who married Margaret Murray, Blackbraes, West Calder, was for many years in the G.P.O., Edinburgh, and on retiring had a cottage to live in built at Blackfaulds. One daughter (Mrs A. Martin) and her husband live near that place at present. John's eldest son became a Baillie in Lauder, and was succeeded as tailor and clothier there by a son. Another son is in Dalkeith, and another in San Francisco.

The Bents daughters were Christina, Mrs William Rankin. Her two sons became road surveyors. Of her four daughters, one still lives in Fauldhouse. Mary of Bents became Mrs John Bishop, Midseat, with sons and daughters. Grace was married to Mr Robert Froom, and has descendants surviving. Margaret was wife of Mr James Smith, Blackburn, who died in the summer of 1908, survived by a number of sons and daughters in Blackburn and elsewhere. The Blackfaulds daughters were Mary Mrs James Turner; Grace, Mrs William Waddell Reeves; and Elizabeth, who became wife of her cousin, John of Crooklands.

Note: When it came to the last son, JB must have tired of his saga as he related little about Alexander Black and Grace Russell's grandchildren; even for the male lines. As the purpose of this website is to outline the people mentioned or eluded to in *Melodies and Memories*, there are quite a few descendants missing from this document, forced by John Black's omissions. The accompanying family tree however does contain many more descendants than those listed in this narrative. Please refer therefore to the tree if your closest ancestor is not mentioned in this document.

*Reminder: * as JB didn't mention this individual, their story ends in the table whereas ^ tells you there is another generation within this document.*

The accompanying tree however might show several more generations than is in this narrative.


ALEXANDER BLACK AND GRACE RUSSELL

Residence - Blackfaulds, Fauldhouse, Whitburn

Alexander, married to **Grace Russell**, was owner and occupier of Blackfaulds. Even in those primitive days some were rich and some not so rich. Their sons were William, of Bents, and Alexander, of Woodmuir... The Blackfaulds daughters were Mary Mrs James Turner; Grace Mrs William Waddell Reeves; and Elizabeth, who became wife of her cousin, John of Crooklands.

ALEXANDER BLACK

Alexander was the youngest child and therefore born at Holehouseburn. He was baptised on 17 January 1742 and a few months later his father died.

BARBARA MUIRHEAD

Barbara was baptised in West Calder on 13 September 1751 to parents James Muirhead and Barbara Orr.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

Their marriage was found in the Whitburn Parish records on 9 January 1771 when Alexander was 28 and Barbara 19.

Two years later the same source shows Barbara died on 20 March 1773. She was buried eight days later.

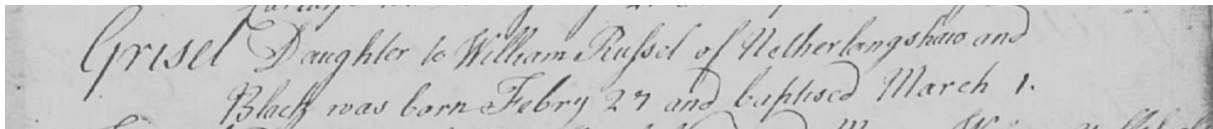

It is probable Barbara died from childbirth complications, but the child may have initially survived. Although the following entry for the purchase of a mortcloth was not until April 1780, no subsequent children for Alexander could have been buried on this date, so the child we believe was Barbara's and although unnamed in the records, they would have been eight.

GRISEL/GRACE RUSSELL

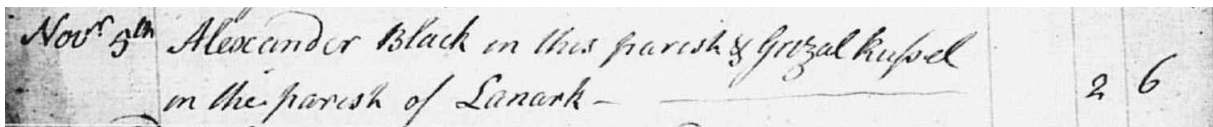
Grace's baptism is possibly the one below and therefore the spelling was Grisel Russel. This Grace was born on 24 February 1751 in the parish of Carluke. Her mother's name was possibly Elizabeth Black as a marriage for William Russell and Elizabeth Black was found in November 1742 at Lanark. Four children were found for this family: two baptised in Lanark and two in Carluke. The address on Grace's baptism is Netherlangshaw; Langshaw is today a farm due south of Carluke.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

Alexander married Grace Russell on 5 November 1775 in Whitburn, nineteen months after the death of his first wife. Grace was from the parish of Lanark so the proclamation was read in both parishes. Alexander was 33 and Grace 24. The spelling now becomes Grizal.

In total Alexander and Grace had eight children, not just the five surviving children named by John Black. The baptism records show some entries were squeezed in at a later date, between two other records, and we can offer no explanation for this.

Alexander's property Blackfaulds was near Fauldhouse, a mile and a half from Liltie-co-kee.² Alexander owned the property when he was 30 and married to his first wife and we wonder if it had come through her.

DEATH AND BURIAL

Grace's death has been identified as 8 March 1807. Alexander died in May 1810 according to the following entry in the Whitburn church records and he would have been 68.

Considering Alexander owned property, and John Black's assumption 'that some were rich and some not so rich' we thought we would find a headstone, but none survives. Blackfaulds does not appear to have remained in the family after his death.

SECOND GENERATION

MARY BLACK AND JAMES TURNER

Residence - Burngrange, Whitburn, West Lothian Lenny Moor, Cramond, Midlothian

MARY BLACK

Mary was born on 26 September 1776 at Blackfaulds and baptised at Whitburn.

² *West Lothian OS Name Books, 1855-1859* Blackfaulds '[Situation] About 6 Chains S. by E. [South by East] of Fauldhouse Rows This name applies to Two Rows of Cottages, one storey high, and thatched, in good repair, formerly a farm house but now converted into dwellings for the use of the colliers and miners employed in the Coalpits of the surrounding district; they are the property of James Waddel Esq. of Crofthead House.' The Waddel's of Crofthead were connected to the Blacks by marriage.

JAMES TURNER

No birth or parentage can be located for James born around 1771.

Although the marriage was not located, the following baptisms were found in the Whitburn Parish records for Mary Black and James Turner.

By the 1841 census they were living at Lenny Moor, Cramond, north of Edinburgh. James was a dairyman at the age of 70.

DEATH AND BURIAL



James died on 10 October 1841 and Mary on 3 March 1846. They were both buried at Livingston along with two of their sons.



WILLIAM BLACK

William was born on 27 February 1780 at Blackfaulds, Whitburn.

JEAN (JANET) CUNNINGHAM

Jean, or Janet as she was known, was the daughter of Alexander Cunningham and Christian Waddle.³ Her birth in Cambusnethan was not located but from her age at death it was estimated around 1779.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

William and Janet married on 25 April 1804 in Cambusnethan. Eight children have been located including Janet who JB omitted to mention by name. The baptism records show the children were born at Holehouseburn. Bents is now a small village due south of Whitburn.

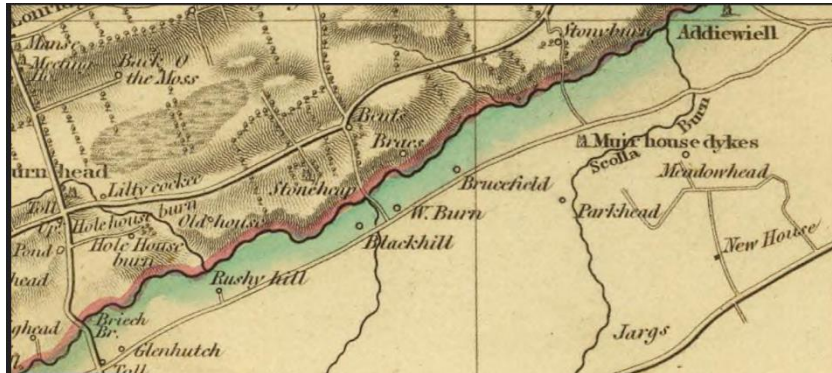

Their eldest son Alexander died in 1833 and the Whitburn South Church has the following inscription:

**Erected By William Black, Tenant in Bents
And Janet Cunningham his Spouse
In memory of their son Alexander
Who died 27 May 1833 age 20y**

By the time of the first census, the couple were getting on in years and had two daughters and two grandchildren, Janet and Peter, living with them at Bents.

Alexander's birth was recorded on 28 December 1781 at Blackfaulds, Whitburn.

Jane was born on 12 April 1785 in West Calder to parents William Russell and Marion Fairley.

None of their children's baptisms were found so birth years are estimated and none of their children were mentioned in *Melodies and Memories*. Information on *Ancestry* infers the family initially lived in Whitburn before moving to Woodmuir in West Calder.

Her birthplace in the census as Cambusnethan is unusual but her death certificate names Alexander Black and Jane Russell as her parents.

⁵ William's death certificate shows his first wife was Mary Black, (as did his daughter's marriage certificate) but we are not sure if she was related.

Alexander was buried on 8 June 1826 and Jane remarried a few years later. Her son James's death certificate showed this information: 'Jane Crawford, previously Black, maiden name Russell.' Jane's second husband was James Crawford and they married on 8 December 1833 in West Calder. They were found on the 1841 census still living at Woodmuir, West Calder. Jean Black aged 20 could be Jane (Janet) who had lowered her age as was required.

DEATH AND BURIAL

As stated earlier, Alexander died in June 1826 and was buried at Whitburn. Jane Russell died at Longridge on 17 August 1858 aged 74 She was buried in the Shotts Churchyard. Her daughter Janet's husband, John Strang was the informant

JAMES BLACK

James born on 23 October 1785 at Blackfaulds, was not mentioned in *Melodies and Memories* and died on 9 February 1860, unmarried aged 74. He had been a farmer and died at Drybridge, a village $\frac{3}{4}$ mile from Fauldhouse. He was buried in the Whitburn churchyard and oddly cannot be found on any census records.

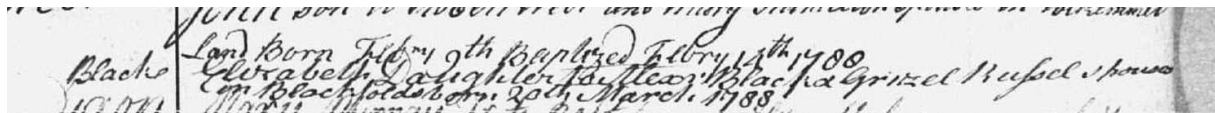

Elizabeth was born on 20 March 1788 in Blackfaulds.

See 'Son-2-2' as Elizabeth married John Black a grandson from this branch. This couple immigrated to New Zealand in 1859. The attached tree for Son-6-Alexander also has full details on Elizabeth and John's descendants.

GRIZEL (GRACE) BLACK AND WILLIAM WADDELL

Residence - Woodmuir, Whitburn, West Lothian

The Blackfaulds daughters were... **Grace**, Mrs **William Waddell Reeves**.

GRIZAL (GRACE) BLACK

Grace was born on 31 December 1789 at Blackfaulds, Whitburn.

WILLIAM WADDELL

Little can be found about this family, perhaps because on the marriage, William was simply shown as William Waddell and the addition of the surname Reeves by John Black is a mystery. One source says William was born on 21 September 1784 in Bathgate the son of George Waddell and Janet Hastie.

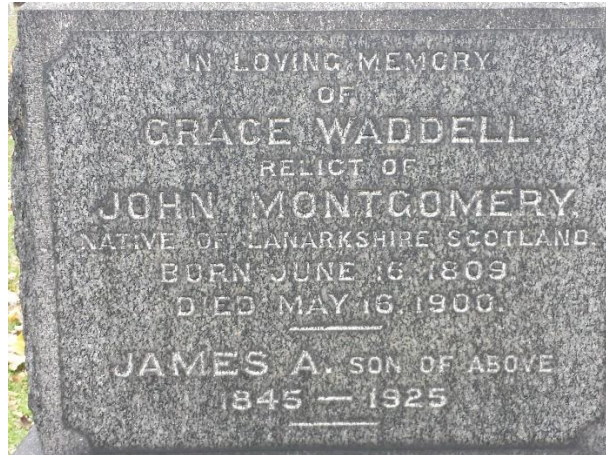
The marriage took place in Whitburn on 3 July 1808 and only one child was found, Grizel Waddell.

DEATH AND BURIAL

If we have the right people, Grace died between 1809 and 1814 as William married Catherine Thomson in Shotts that year. William Waddell died in Ontario, Canada in 1871. Grace his daughter also went to Canada after the death of her husband John Montgomery in 1853 in Whitburn.

Christina was born on 28 December 1806 at Bents in Whitburn.

William was born in Cambusnethan on 10 August 1799 to Andrew Rankin and Catherine Pettigrew.

MARRIAGE AND CHILDREN

The marriage for Christina and William was announced in both the parish of Whitburn on 1 January 1830 and in West Calder on 17 January 1830. The pair made their home in the later location. Eight children were found but two died in childhood so John, despite not naming them identified the number of Christina's adult children.

DEATH AND BURIAL

Christina died on 18 November 1881; William had died over twenty years earlier on 22 March 1864. They were buried in Whitburn.

In Memory of Will Rankin, born at Kirkhall Cambusnethan 10/8/1799, died at Breich Bridge, West Calder 22/3/1864. In 1871 the only servant in the home was Christina Smith, Mary's great niece.

DEATH AND BURIAL

John died on 28 June 1868 and Mary was shown on several census as the head of the house and the farmer of Midseat. The burial records show she died on 7 January 1884 which is in conflict with the headstone. Both were buried at Whitburn.



In Memory Of John Bishop Farmer, Midseat, who died 22/6/1866 aged 66 years and of John his son who died 24/11/1851 aged 3 years also of Jessie Steele who died 17/7/1875 aged 5 months, Mary Black spouse of John Bishop died 31/12/1882 aged 63 years. John Bishop died 31/3/1894 aged 41 years, Alexander Bishop died 30/3/1910 aged 60 years, Thomas Bishop died 28/5/1910 aged 62 years, Margaret Bishop died 15/10/1930 aged 75 years.

In 1891 five of the unmarried children were still living at Midseat. Only one child married. We have not confirmed who Jessie Steele was who died in 1873 aged three months and was listed on the headstone.⁷

When Margaret Bishop died on 15 October 1930, the death notice stated she died at Midseat and she was the last survivor of the family of the late John Bishop.

They married on 13 December 1850 and may have had a child out of wedlock as Robert was six months old on the census form. He was the first of their nine known children.

James's story with the Blacks continued when he married **Elizabeth Smith Black** (Son 2.1).

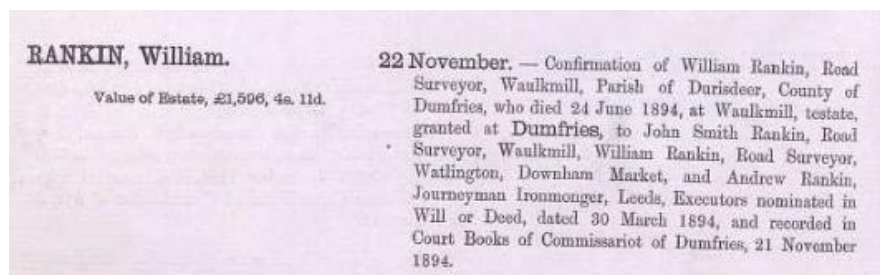

Also Agnes Smith his wife who died at Carronbank 26th March 1910 aged 70 years. Also John Smith Rankin their son for 34 years road surveyor to Thornhill district who died at Waulk Mill 12th April 1928 aged 56 years. Also Jane Maxwell his wife who died at Waulk Mill 23rd February 1960 aged 78 years. Also Christina Black daughter of John and Jane Smith Rankin, Waulk Mill died 9th April 1947 aged 28 years. Also Janet Bishop daughter of the above William Rankin who died at Waulk Mill 21st May 1952 aged 83 years. This memorial is erected by his employees and a few friends. Also John Smith son of John and Jane Smith Rankin, Waulk Mill died 29th April 1957 aged 39 years. Also Ethel daughter of John and Jane Rankin died 11th June 1980 aged 73 years.
